



Presidential Qualification #2

 Constitution says in Article 2, Section 1, "… neither shall any Person be eligible to that Office who shall not have attained to the Age of thirty five Years…"


- You must be at least 35 years old

 - Who was the oldest President?






CAN THEY BE PRESIDENT?


- Thirty-year old from New Jersey who has been a Senator for fouryears already.
