- Public opinion poll: sampling the public in an effort to predict or get an estimate of public attitudes of an issue









- 3 percent sampling error


Hand-held cellular device while driving.




Hands-free cellular device while driving.




HANDS-FREE vs. HAND-HELD




Texting While Driving




How often do you text and drive






